HIGHLIGHTED INFORMATION

- Discover the Historic Center, one of the best-preserved in Latin America, which has been declared a World Heritage Site, and the "Middle of the World," where you can stand with one foot in the northern hemisphere and the other in the southern hemisphere.
- Delight yourself with a visit to Otavalo, in the central Plaza de Ponchos, where locals dressed in traditional indigenous clothing sell colorful textiles and crafts.
- Visit Cotopaxi National Park, home to the iconic volcano, which is one of the highest active volcanoes in the world, with an altitude of 5,897 meters above sea level.
- Baños de Agua Santa is a picturesque town known for being a popular tourist destination due to its stunning natural surroundings, hot springs, waterfalls, outdoor activities, and vibrant local culture.
- Cuenca is a city with a rich history, beautiful architecture, and a vibrant cultural life. It is a popular destination for both national and international tourists who wish to explore the beauty and culture of this Ecuadorian city.



Description

DAY 1 - (-/-/D)

Airport Transfer - Hotel Welcome to Quito!

A representative from Ocean Pacific Travel will greet you and transfer you to your hotel.

DAY 2 - (B/-/D)

AM - City Tour Tour the colonial Quito.

The places you will visit will confirm why UNESCO named Quito the first World Heritage Site. Start with a visit to El Panecillo, the historic hill on the south side of the historic center, where the winged Virgin of Quito statue stands, visible from almost any point in the city. Next, head to the Plaza and Church of San Francisco, the Church of the Society of Jesus with its seven tons of gold that make its walls glow, and the bustling Independence Square, flanked by the Presidential Palace and the Quito Cathedral.

PM - Afternoon at leisure

DAY 3 - (B/-/D)

AM - Otavalo

Transfer to the north of Quito through beautiful mountain landscapes dotted with small villages, white churches, and blue lagoons. Our first stop will be Guachalá and the Quitsato sundial, located about 70 kilometers from Quito. Here is a monument to the Middle of the World: a large sundial.

From Quitsato, we will continue north to Otavalo. This small city, with about 50,000 inhabitants, is known for its friendly people and its world-famous market, an event that has been held here since pre-Inca times. The Otavaleños are the most prosperous indigenous group in the country, likely because their textiles, rugs, colorful ponchos, indigenous jewelry, and beautiful fabrics are so exquisite.

Next, you will visit the town of Peguche to meet a local artisan who makes musical instruments. Later, we will enjoy an easy walk to the beautiful Peguche waterfall. Finally, we will return to Quito in the afternoon. The return trip takes

approximately two hours.

DAY 4 - (B/-/D) AM - Intiñan (Middle of the World)

We will head north of Quito to the "Middle of the World," where we can stand with one foot in each hemisphere and appreciate the many teachings of the Intiñan Site Museum. This museum is situated right on the equator line and features exhibits on pre-Columbian life in Ecuador, as well as demonstrations on astronomy, geography, physics, and phenomena related to the equatorial line.

PM - Afternoon at leisure

DAY 5 - (B/-/D)

AM - Cotopaxi National Park

This morning, we will head to Cotopaxi National Park, traveling through what Alexander von Humboldt called the "Avenue of the Volcanoes."





This scientist visited Ecuador in the 18th century, collecting important data on the country's biology and geography. The Cotopaxi volcano, one of the highest active volcanoes, gives the park its name. The beauty of its perfect cone dominating the landscape never ceases to amaze us. Within the park, you can walk around the Limpiopungo lagoon or visit the pre-Inca ruins of El Salitre. If you pay close attention, you might spot wild horses or a condor, an endangered species.

PM - Baños de Agua Santa

In our visit to Baños, we will see the Gothic-style cathedral, built with black volcanic stone, and the Virgen de Agua Santa museum, which displays various curious objects as well as the Virgin's dresses and jewelry donated by devotees in gratitude for blessings received. Here, we will discover paintings depicting the miracles of the Virgin and her influence on Catholics over the last centuries.

The streets of the town provide an excellent opportunity to see melcocheros, artisans who work with cane sugar molasses and transform it into a typical Baños sweet. We can also visit the balsa and tagua wood carvers, art galleries, and craft shops. Don't forget to look up from time to time to see the imposing and roaring Tungurahua Volcano!

DAY 6 - (B/-/D) AM - Route of the Waterfalls

After breakfast, you will begin your visit Pastaza River Ecological alona the Corridor, an emblematic refuge of flora fauna due to its strategic geographical location. This area is home to a variety of micro-watersheds, habitats, and landscapes, surrounded by two National Parks. You will observe several waterfalls until you reach the most impressive one known as the Pailón del Diablo. This is one of the most spectacular and visited waterfalls in Ecuador. This stunning waterfall is a must-see for tourists exploring the region, and its name, which means "Devil's Cauldron," reflects its power and beauty.


PM - Transfer to Cuenca

Relax and enjoy this journey filled with beautiful landscapes and stories within the Andes mountain range.

DAY 7 - (B/-/D) AM - Cajas National Park

We will depart from Cuenca and head to El Cajas National Park, one of Ecuador's natural wonders. Its 235 glacial lakes shine amidst a stunning environment of páramo grasslands, beautiful waterfalls, and spectacular rock formations. Enjoy hikes along the trails while listening to the wild birds. There are approximately 125 bird species, including the endangered Andean condor, trogons, sword-billed hummingbirds, glittering hummingbirds, and many more.





El Cajas is covered with páramos (highaltitude grasslands) full of impressive microflora, including beautiful flowers, mosses, lichens, fungi, and more. El Cajas is listed among the world's RAMSAR reserves (wetlands of international importance) and AICAS (important bird conservation areas of international importance). For these reasons and more, El Cajas is a paradise for hikers, bird watchers, and any nature lover.

PM - Afternoon at leisure

DAY 8 - (B/L/-)

AM - City Tour and Transfer to

Guayaquil

Today, we will enjoy strolling through the cobblestone streets of Cuenca, visiting flowery plazas and picturesque sites. We will start at San Sebastian Plaza, on the western side of the colonial quarter, and walk through narrow streets to the Museum Modern Art, where various contemporary Ecuadorian artists exhibit their work. Heading towards the city center, we will visit Cuenca's famous flower market with its colorful stalls of calla lilies, orchids, and roses. Soon, we will see the Neo-Gothic New Cathedral with its characteristic blue domes. Construction began in 1880 to replace the Old Cathedral (still standing across from the new one), built by the Spanish in 1557, the year the city was founded.

PM - Transfer to Guayaquil Airport

RECOMMENDATIONS:
